

Green Valley Council February 16, 2023 Meeting Summary of Key Issues

Pima County Supervisor Steve Christy

Discussed the closing of the 10 freeway due to the accident involving hazardous materials. Supervisor Christy felt the Pima County Emergency Management was lacking a plan dealing with this.

He also was critical of the park fee increase that the Pima County Board passed because there was confusion on the fee increase and it was not posted.

Presentation by Pima County Sheriff Chris Nanos

Discussed the terrible conditions of the adult detention center (jail). The conditions of the jail are not good because of mold, poor circulation, poor design, poor air quality and overcrowding. A committee was approved to look at the situation and will make recommendations on if a new jail is needed or if part of the jail could be used in conjunction with building a new jail. A subcommittee will research the costs of any proposal and possible funding sources.

Pima County Sheriff's Department

Crime is down in Green Valley for the month of January. A radar camera was set up on one of the major streets in Green Valley for two weeks that checked the speed of vehicles traveling on this street. There were 19,000 vehicles per week and 27% of those were going at least 10 miles over the speed limit (this is low compared to the rest of Pima County). Because of this the Sheriff's Department will be increasing traffic enforcement.

Commander Doug Kenyon of Green Valley Sheriff's Auxiliary Volunteers

On March 23 there will be another First Responders event. Also be aware of the increase in traffic around Valley Presbyterian Church during their patio sale which will be held March 9-11.

Tom Murphy Major of Sahuarita

The Global Water Company has taken over FICO water. On February 21, the traffic signal at the intersection of Old Nogales Highway at Quail Crossing Boulevard will be activated in flashing operation.

Scott Somers CEO of GV Recreation

Reminded us that the election is coming up and to vote. Scott will also be starting his chat with members. Look for dates and times.

Update from Tom Berezny Board of Supervisors District 4 Representative

Tom spoke about the repaving of roads that has been going on and how the cost has doubled for this. At next months council meeting a representative from the county will speak about the process of taking private HOA roads over.
