UPDATES

Steve Christy, Pima County Board of Supervisors, District 4 absent, Tom Berezny reporting

- Issue of immigration federal funds running out at end of March is still not on agenda. Closing all Welcome Centers will mean street releases. Still hoping Feds will come through with money.
- New outdoor lighting reg still being reviewed. HOA may ask for an assessment for their area.
- Hospice house in CCVI is still being reviewed and described as a “ping-pong” game. The hospice house is classifying their unit as a group home. This runs contrary to HOA rules, but not Fed Fair Housing.
- Although interest in a new Circle K and the hospital have circulated, no permits have been filed.

- Major expansion of personnel under way. 30 new hires in training. May see them jogging around a lot.
- Easter weekend is the busiest time for Madera Canyon. Access will be limited and controlled. Use caution around the roads and area.
