Subject: **GVC Board of Representatives Committee Notes of April 17, 2025**

\***Financial review** continues to appear awkward as either timely posting of expenses and revenue have not caught up which again does not coincide with budget versus actual.

\***District IV supervisor Steve Christy** was not in attendance as a meeting conflict was evident, his presentation is always missed relative to the ongoing issues of interest in the county as a whole.

\* **Sheriff's report**, Green Valley will lose the current Pima County Sergeant for the district as a shuffling of staff is generally called for after a ten year period of time. He definitely is an officer who will be missed, his qualities included community relationships and his ability to develop his staff. Ignoring the statistics this period is appropriate as the tourism sector of Green Valley with the departure of our seasonal owners and guest does not provide an accurate comparison. Red light runners at the intersection of Continental and the frontage road is a notable problem. No accidents are on record, which is debatable. All users with a destination of Safeway or the strip mall should be aware of risk.

\* No report from **GVR** other than patronage of the food service operator on Camino del Sol who is reportedly doing an outstanding business to include quality.

\* **Rosemont Mining Company**, I questioned the status of the environmental process seeking approval for a major mining operation in The Santa Rita Mountains directly east and north of Green Valley. I suggested perhaps that GVC should represent the interest of the valley. The issues of water consumption, contamination, air quality and view corridors were of significant interest from our HOA and others should also be concerned. The response was the mine is out of the area of representation of GVC.

\* **Town of Sahuarita**, the mayor was absent, no report. Other HOAs from that geographic area are still complaining about the lack of progress on the Abrego/Duval Mine road intersection which is slow, unsightly and dangerous, the project includes the addition of sidewalks and the addition of a right turn lane eastbound off Nogales Highway on Abrego.
