Subject: GVC Board of Representatives Committee Notes

- Two new directors were sworn in who will participate in the executive committee to further guide and provide directions to GVC staff and personnel for insights into areas they may have past professional experience to benefit the local governance of Green Valley.
- Steve Christy from the Pima County Board of Supervisors was unavailable. Doug Kenyon, who is the representative to the supervisors office from Green Valley, provided a brief report on potential delayed response times from Green Valley Fire. The complaint is being processed for further detail pertaining to the report. In previous updates, it was reported that Doug Kenyon was the Commander for the Sheriff's Auxiliary. He was a qualified individual to replace Tom Berezny who moved away from Green Valley. This is his first report since becoming the District IV representative from Green Valley.
- Pima County Sheriff's auxiliary report contained traffic stops, DUI's, arrests and citations which were not remarkable. The auxiliary reminds those folks who may be in need of a "courtesy wellbeing call" to register with the fire department to obtain a lock box for entry. The sheriff's office is the entity that can access the lock box.
- GVR has found a very competent food service operator for the Del Sol Clubhouse location. The 1989 Bake House comes highly recommended for breakfast, pastries and lunch.
- Elections are coming up for board seats for GVR if members are so inclined.
- Green Valley Council is participating and promoting with a small fee, National Walk the Park Day. The date is March 30th, and it will commence at Canoa Ranch Parking lot.
- Pima County is reviewing the Pima County Flood Control plan. The intent is to identify high risk areas, preserve natural water courses, mitigate damage through changes or additions to structures. In February of this year the flood control management should be completed and approved at the March Meeting.
