Subject: GVC Board of Representatives Committee Notes

* Review of financials illustrated some expense line items were over for the month but timing YTD would bring those line items back on budget.

* Steve Christie, Pima County Supervisor district IV had critical comments concerning an ongoing investigation by the Department of Homeland Security directed at Pima County. The investigation concerns the potential wrongful encouragement at immigrant welcome centers of extended stays and incorrect information as to disbursement of the same. Financial assistance to Arizona and Pima County may be in jeopardy. The investigation by Homeland Security continues.

* Fire Department, Santa Rita District, the wildfire mitigation plan continues to be formulated to further avoid the constant nuisance of the drought in Arizona and the critical issue which is on the majority of people's minds relative to the Los Angeles crisis.

* Sheriff's Report, high seasonal visitation remains very active, however soon to be reduced by the historical departure dates for Green Valley tourism. Traffic stops fell into the usual norm with little exception. Breaking and entering is nil with two DUI's. A rural safety plan is being considered and devised as the result of a recent incident involving loss of life in an unusual brutal crime. This is not in Green Valley, but in rural areas with extended drive time to a populated area. Drug disposal is available at the sheriff's department on La Canada, no containers just pills capsules and creams or inhalers.

Tom Murphy, Mayor Sahuarita, The Sahuarita Festival is Saturday April 5, live band, food and fun, 2 pm - 8 pm. Pressure is on the construction company to complete the intersection on Abrego and Duval Mine or Nogales Hy intersection, ongoing for way too long.
