Subject: Board of Representatives GVC Committee Notes – **November 20th** meeting

* The financial report was reviewed and accepted as presented, the timing of payments in the budgeted month and the actual month of payment was out line but promised due to timing versus the budget and the actual would come back into line the following month.

* Steve Christy our representative from district four of the county supervisors reported on a special meeting in Tucson between the county supervisors and the city council of Tucson which contentious and a conflicted session. The hot topic was the use of city and county funding for homelessness and the inefficiency of spending with poor results for the amount of dollars expended. He is up against a political supermajority to continue funding and throwing money at a project that he contends is a failure.

* Tom Murphy, mayor of Sahuarita, winter fest is set to kick off December 13 at 3 pm to 8 pm. Tree lighting and a festive parade will initiate the celebration. Food vendors should be available pending registration of the same.

* Chief Wunder of the Santa Rita Fire District, tourist traffic is increasing early this season with increased calls relative to slip and falls. Kitchen fires during the entirety of the holiday season are especially a factor with gas appliances for those who come to Green Valley using gas as opposed to equipment used in their home surroundings.

* Lt. Bernstein Pima County sheriff's department, 611 calls received during the reporting period, speeding, DUI and nuisance calls make up the majority. Please remember the district includes the area surrounding Green Vally as well. Red light runners with the increased traffic is an issue in a variety of locations mostly on Continental and Esperanza.

* President Kenyon, Green Valley Council, building progress on the new GVC office building has been extremely slow, with site visits from a number of contractors. Wild fire mitigation is ongoing with continued input from interested parties and the formation of a meaningful plan. The health van makes its usual stop at the Joyner Library if the need arises for conscientious folks who monitor or who need to monitor fundamental and elementary issues such as blood pressure, blood sugar and issues that come up that contrary to a normal healthy life present unwanted observable changes.
