


CSE II ARBORETUM

We thank Dana Berry for his generous gift of path side benches, they add just the right polish to our beautiful space.

Planting has begun and is nearly complete for this season. Through your generous donations we have planted a Desert Willow tree, an Arizona Feather tree and a Redbud tree. In addition we have planted Fairy Dusters along the upper round railings, a Globe Mallow on the east side of the small table and a Desert Sage on the west side. Gooding Verbena will spread beneath the Desert Willow and a Chuparosa will add color to the south side of the Tejedor path. A watering schedule is in the works. LOCKBOX PROGRAM

Recently, one of our neighbors had a kitchen fire that filled the house with smoke.

The stove was accidentally left on with a pot on the burner when the couple went out. Fortunately, a neighbor delivering directories noticed the smoke and called the fire department. When the fire department arrived, they needed to break a window to get inside. Fortunately the damage was minor.

The broken window could have been avoided with a simple residential lockbox. The GreenValley Fire District will provide a secure lockbox that makes a key to your house available to fire and other emergency responders. FIREWISE COMMITTEE

FireWise is a program to reduce wildfire risks to the home (and, in our case, to the HOA).

We are seeing more instances of wildfires burning houses and injuring and killing people. As part of my work on the Common Grounds Committee, I viewed the vegetation south of the houses along Picamaderos and saw some trees of concern. For these reasons, when we heard about this FireWise program, we were interested.

FireWise is a national program that is done in cooperation with the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), the US Department of Agriculture Forest Service, the US Department of the Interior, and the National Association of State Foresters. More information about the program can be found at <u>firewise.org</u>.

On Nov. 3, Anna and I attended the "911 Forum" hosted by Green Valley Council. Many of the local first responders made presentations. One presentation was by the Green Valley CERT and included FireWise, a free program administered in Arizona by the state of Arizona.

After hearing about the program, I suggested to John Sucher that our HOA might benefit. He brought it up to our HOA board who concurred with hearing a free presentation.

At the Jan. 19 board meeting, John McGee of the Green Valley CERT made a presentation. The onsite evaluation is free. It will be used to develop an action plan. There may be grants available for some identified projects. Once the required work is completed, some insurance companies provide home owner insurance discounts.

Subsequently, the board approved submitting an application for the on-site evaluation to be done.

The evaluation will be done by employees of the Arizona Department of Forestry and Fire Management; people who fight wildfires and fully understand the dangers. Since their first priority is fighting fires. The evaluations are done during their less busy periods. I recently received a phone call scheduling the site evaluation for May 2.

Since all the land that surrounds our HOA is owned by the San Ignacio Golf Course, the evaluation will be available to them and we have invited a representative to participate in the on-site evaluation.

Our committee members are Larry Bennett (chair; Garzota), Kathy Merrill (Trogon), Candy English (Urraca), Terry Steenrod (Reyecuelo), and Gary Karger (Reyecuelo). At the April 20 board meeting, I asked for a volunteer from Picamaderos but have not yet had any volunteers. We are very fortunate to have Kathy participating since she worked on a previous FireWise evaluation for her subdivision in Colorado.
